

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-176

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE
DISPENSING WITH COMPETITIVE BIDDING PURSUANT TO ELK GROVE
MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 3.42 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER
TO EXECUTE A PURCHASE ORDER WITH FARO TECHNOLOGIES FOR
THE PURCHASE OF A 3-D INCIDENT RECONSTRUCTION SCANNER
IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$82,000 THROUGH A COOPERATIVE
PURCHASING AGREEMENT**

WHEREAS, the Elk Grove Police Department investigates all major traffic collisions and crimes in the City of Elk Grove; and

WHEREAS, the Department currently utilizes a Total Station device to record pertinent environmental points of a traffic collision or crime scene for the purpose of investigation; and

WHEREAS, the Department's Total Station device is nine years old and is not an efficient investigative tool and is considered obsolete by many in law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the Department is seeking to replace its Total Station device with current technology that is more efficient and exact in reconstructing complicated traffic collisions and crime scenes; and

WHEREAS, the Faro 3-D scanner uses laser technology to produce three dimensional models that can result in images that provide an exact digital reproduction of an incident; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Sections 3.42.180(B)(4) and 3.42.220, the City Council may dispense with the competitive bidding process when the purchase is processed through a cooperative purchasing agreement; and

WHEREAS, the State of Utah has secured competitive pricing for this particular commodity for the benefit of all government agencies, and the City of Elk Grove may take advantage of such pricing; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has sufficient funding in its Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund (2182200-5406002) for this purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby dispenses with competitive bidding pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Section 3.42 and authorizes the City Manager to execute a purchase order with Faro Technologies for the purchase of a 3-D Incident Reconstruction Scanner in an amount not to exceed \$82,000 through a cooperative purchasing agreement.




