

**RESOLUTION NO. 2024-054**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE  
AUTHORIZING THE PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR TO REJECT ALL BIDS  
RECEIVED FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS – PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE  
MAINTENANCE (PIM) PROJECT (OM2404) AND DIRECTING THE  
PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR TO RE-BID THE PROJECT (CEQA EXEMPT)**

**WHEREAS**, the Public Works – Public Infrastructure Maintenance (PIM) Project (OM2404) (Project) includes a full-time Public Works maintenance crew along with the required equipment, materials, goods, hardware and tools depending on the type of work needed; and

**WHEREAS**, an invitation to bid was duly advertised on February 16, 2024 and February 23, 2024, and electronic bids were received on March 14, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, after review of the bids received, staff has determined the need to revise the quantities on the bid schedule to better address the City’s needs and the need to conduct a non-mandatory pre-bid meeting; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the City’s best interest to reject all bids received and re-bid the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Project is a project under California Environmental Quality Act (Section 21000 et seq. of the Public Resources Code, hereinafter referred to as CEQA), which requires that cities consider the environmental consequences of their actions before approving a project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Project is included in the approved Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby:

- 1) Finds the rejection of all bids exempt from environmental review under CEQA (CEQA Guidelines, § 15270 [projects not approved are exempt from CEQA]), and further finds that the Public Works – Public Infrastructure Maintenance (PIM) Project (OM2404), if and when it proceeds, is itself exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301 (existing facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines based upon the following finding:

Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines (Chapter 3 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations) provides an exemption from CEQA for projects involving the minor alteration of existing public or private facilities when the alteration involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use.” As the Project involves repair and maintenance of existing infrastructure and will involve negligible or no expansion of use, it qualifies for the identified exemption and no additional environmental review under CEQA is required; and

- 2) Authorizes the Public Works Director to reject all bids received on March 14, 2024 for the Project; and

3) Directs the Public Works Director to re-bid the Project.
